For large home renovation projects please consider factoring in the cost of hiring a skip or using a commercial waste contractor to dispose of your waste. Our sites are not designed to accept large quantities of this type of waste.

It is important to always check that any contractor you hire to dispose of your waste is a [registered waste carrier](#)

If you bring **any** type of waste arising from the construction, alteration or repair of your home or garden to one of our Community Recycling Centres in a **van, pick-up or trailer**, you will be redirected to a [waste transfer station](#) where your waste will be weighed and a charge made.

**\*Vans, pickups and trailers** bringing non charging scheme waste into our sites, are still required to have a [valid van permit](#)

Where charges are applicable, payment must be made to a Charging Scheme Officer at the entrance prior to the customer being granted access to the chargeable containers to tip their waste. Charges are non-negotiable and the decision of the site staff will be final.
