We believe in a stronger fairer Surrey enabling everyone to support organisations who are making a positive difference to our communities so that no one is left behind.

Our mission is to make a lasting difference to Surrey by being a catalyst in the county through connecting people, ideas and resources to need.

- Turn Private money into Community money
- Focus on grassroots, local support
- Mean Average grant £5.5k (Mode £10k); 2023-24 ~£2M
- Funding is reactive & responsive but also increasingly targeted and based on evidence-based impact
- Over £22M awarded since set-up in 2005
- > 47 UK CFs have £171M assets

How does it work?



- Single 'front door' Expression of Interest – short, accessible
- grants rounds 3 x year dates on website
- > 2-3 months max for decision
- Area Funds also able to award small(<£2.5k) unrestricted grants rapidly</p>
- Fund charities & community groups, schools for community activities but not local authorities
- Some grants for individuals e.g. SYPF
